
Diabetes and Heart Disease Make the Link

Protocols and other strategies can help ensure that patients with diabetes will get the CVD screening tests, education and information they need.¹

Examples Include:

- Standing orders for routine tests, screenings and referrals
- Electronic registry or medical records to track diabetes patient care and CVD risk factors
- Case management of patients who need help controlling their hyperglycemia, hypertension or dyslipidemia
- Previsit assessment of CVD risk factors and self-care behaviors
- Patient support systems easily accessible (classes, support groups, nurse answer lines, etc.)
- Ongoing counseling and education for patients in managing their diabetes, changing behaviors and reducing their CVD risk
- · Coordination between primary and specialty care
